 - Games








Logistics

- Compliance with Charities Act 2014 all fundraising flyers, posters, ads must state "kaising tunas for Bermuaa Cancer and Health Centre, registered charity #70"
- Parking
 - o Due to limited parking, we will not be able to provide Volunteer or Survivor reserved parking
 - o Shuttle will run from Arboretum to Roberts Avenue
 - o Disable Parking will be available permit holders only
 - Traffic flow for Set up/break down:
 - > Set up/Break down: NW entrance on Roberts Avenue (sandlot entrance close to Devon Lane will service campsites on the NW side of track and Frog Lane entrance will service campsites on the Eastern side of track
 - > Set up is between 10:00am and 4:00pm on FRI MAY 12th
- Permits are required to sell food (applications on <u>www.bermudarelay.com</u>)
- Relay For Life is a family-friendly and community-oriented, alcohol must not be part of team/participant fundraising activities
- No Glass (National Sports Centre management is stressing this)
- No Smoking Allowed
- No Barbequing (open flames)
- No Animals
- No wheels on the track; only wheelchairs and strollers
- Tent space: provide your own water weights. Stakes can go no deeper than 8 inches into the grass
- Vehicles are not allowed on the grass
- Onsite Camp Requirement forms, let's us know whether you need power and if you want your fundraiser in the programme. Forms in by APR 30th
