TEAM CAPTAIN RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Recruit team members and motivate your team with the "why"
- Work with your team on setting a team fundraising goal
- Ask all team members to raise a minimum of \$100
- o Ensure your team understands where the donations go
- Stay up to date on communications from the Event Committee and attend Team Captain meetings to get crucial event information, tips, and inspiration
- Communicate with your team members regularly
- Provide team members with fundraising tools and guidelines
- o Inspire, motivate, and appreciate your team members
- Thank your team members for their time and commitment to the fight against cancer
- o Encourage each team member to participate in the way most meaningful to them

TEAM CAPTAIN OR DELEGATE TO A TEAM MEMBER:

- o Find special ways to recognize the cancer survivors and caregivers on your team
- o Coordinate the execution of your team's theme, costumes and décor
- Create and coordinate the walkers schedule for your team
- Handle all campsite logistics and planning for the event
- o Run a team mission activity at your campsite
- Plan and host team fundraisers in advance of the event
